CHIEF OFFICER 3D EMERGENCY SERVICE DELIVERY

RESPONSIBILITIES FOR CHIEF FIRE OFFICERS

This course provides students with a basic knowledge of the emergency service requirements related to the roles and responsibilities of a Chief Fire Officer including developing a plan for the integration of fire services resources, developing an agency resource contingency plan, evaluating incident facilities, supervising multiple resources, developing and utilizing an incident action plan, obtaining incident information to facilitate transfer of command, developing and conducting a post-incident analysis, and maintaining incident records. This course is designed for the certified Company Officer advancing to the Chief Fire Officer classification.

Additional materials fees may be required. This class limited to 25 students. May not be offered every semester.
